Pick up and dispose of your dog's poo in the appropriate container for organic waste

Excrement is a way of spreading disease between pets and can create outbreaks of infection through parasite eggs that can infect people

It's very unpleasent to see dog poop on the street and gives a bad image to neighbours and visitors



The hands, the soles of shoes, a ball can transmit a parasite that affects children between 2 and 7 yrs and can cause serious eye diseases

The law 4/94 of the 8th of July by the Valencian Generalitat regarding the protection of pets, article 8,paragraphs 1,2 & 3 state:

- 1.-The owner and person in charge of the animal, Hill be responsable for all resulting damages, according to the applicable legislation.
- 2.- The owner or person in charge must take any measures deemed most appropriate to prevent the soiling of walkways and public spaces. The Town Halls can provide adequate facilities for this purpose in parks, playgrounds and public places.
- 3.- In the case of non-compliance with the measures referred to in the previous paragraphs, the Town Halls can impose a fine on the owners of the animals, the fine being set by the governing bodies in the respective ordinance.

At local level there is a Coexistence Municipal Ordinance which promotes the reduction of organic waste caused by pet droppings. The aim is to improve the welfare and conviviality of citizens and their pets



The fine is regulated by said Ordinance and being listed as serious, will range between 375 and 750 €
